### Reservation Confirmation

Welcome to Montecito Sequoia's **Family Vacation Camp!** We are delighted to confirm your reservation and look forward to your arrival soon. If there are any changes or corrections to your reservation confirmation, please call our Reservations phone number at 800-227-9900. Please also let our reservations staff know if anyone in your party has food allergies, so we can inform our kitchen staff. We also ask that you please contact us well in advance of your camp week to discuss if you have a child or adult in your party that may need accommodations. Thank you!

### *General Information*

#### **Arrival and Departure:**

Check-in time is between 3:00 and 5:00 pm on Sunday of your camp week, and departure time is after breakfast and our "Awards" Round Up on Saturday morning (Check out time is 11:00 am on Saturday). *If you will be arriving later than 7:00 pm on Sunday, we recommend that you call the Front Desk @ 559-565-3388 to give them an estimated time of arrival and/or to request that a dinner plate be made for late arrivals. If you are departing before Saturday morning, please make arrangements with the Front Desk to check out before your departure - sorry, we do not offer prorating for missed meals or days. There will be someone working at the Front Desk to help you between 7am & 9pm, with a manager "on call" after hours.*

#### **Location and Directions:**

Montecito Sequoia Lodge & Summer Family Camp is located at 63410 Generals Highway, inside the gates of Sequoia & Kings Canyon National Parks. **For the quickest route to our lodge, we recommend that guests DO NOT USE GPS!** Due to our remote location, GPS will often send you the long way up and around the mountain, adding hours to your already long trip. Additionally, due to ongoing roadwork, entering the parks from the south (via the Sequoia National Park entrance) may cause significant delays to your travel times. **For the easiest route to our location (from Northern or Southern California), access our lodge via Hwy. 180 East in Fresno:**

- Drive towards Fresno via Highway 99 (from the North or South).
- Exit onto Highway 180 East (towards Kings Canyon).
- Follow Highway 180 all the way up to the Kings Canyon Park Entrance Station.
- Pay your Sequoia & Kings Canyon Parks Entry Fee (\$35 per vehicle/\$70 Annual Pass to SEKI); Note: You can opt to prepay for your Parks entry pass online here: <https://www.recreation.gov/sitepass/72471>
- Continue straight into the park on Highway 180.
- Take the first Right-hand turn (direction towards Sequoia National Park & the General Sherman Tree) onto the Generals Highway (aka Highway 198).
- Drive approximately 8 miles and you will drive by the Montecito Sequoia Lodge Main entrance (temporarily closed due to bridge construction). Continue straight on the Generals Hwy for another 1.2 miles. Turn Right into the Far Horizons Camp Entrance Road (you will see a **Montecito Detour** sign at this intersection). Continue following the Montecito Detour signs along the graded gravel & dirt road until you arrive at camp (Please Drive **SLOWLY** to minimize damage to the roadbed). Staff will be stationed as you enter Camp and provide further instructions on where to park your vehicle and unload.

#### **Gasoline:**

We recommend that you fill up with gas before entering the parks. **The last gas station before entering the parks is the Valero Gas Station & Market at Clingan's Junction on Highway 180.** NOTE: There is a 24-hour credit card gas pump.

#### **Parks Entrance Fee:**

Since Montecito Sequoia Lodge is located inside the gates of Sequoia & Kings Canyon Parks, all our guests must pay the National Parks entrance fee. The NPS fee for Sequoia & Kings Canyon National Parks is \$35 for a 7-day pass, or \$70 for an annual pass, per vehicle. **Go to our website ([www.mslodge.com/directions](http://www.mslodge.com/directions)) for any updated directions/entry fees.** Again, we WELCOME YOU TO MONTECITO SEQUOIA'S FAMILY VACATION CAMP! This is your Final Packet of Information, PLEASE SAVE IT & BRING IT WITH YOU TO CAMP for reference. ## *Sunday Family Camp Arrival Schedule*

Please plan to arrive at between 3:00 and 5:00 pm on Sunday – Rooms are promised between 4:00 pm – 5:00 pm, but if they are not ready upon your arrival, we can get your fun started anyway!

### **3:00 pm – 5:00 pm: Checking in and Getting Started**

- **Checking In:** Upon arrival, you will be greeted at our **Outdoor Welcome Table**. Our staff will welcome you with refreshments and cookies after your long drive. We will also provide Name Tags for everyone in your party, and your children will receive their Montecito Camp Group T-shirts. Our staff can also answer any questions that you may have.
- **Front Desk:** After visiting our outdoor welcome table, please proceed to the Front Desk for official check-in, and to receive your room or cabin assignment & key cards. **You will also be asked for your completed *Health Form and Acknowledgement of Risk Form (included in this confirmation packet)*, which needs to be signed by each member of your party. (Please note that these forms must be turned in before guests can participate in activities, so it is best to bring the forms already filled out with you).** Once you've received your room/cabin keys from the Front Desk and your room is ready, our staff at the greeting table can help you with your luggage too – just ask for help!
- **Camp Tours:** You will have time to take a camp tour with a member of our staff to familiarize yourself with the camp layout and to view the activity areas. Tours are highly recommended for our first-time guests.
- **Lake Checks in the Pool:** A lifeguard will be on duty at the pool to assess your “Lake Safety Swimming Ability,” and will provide you your first opportunity to qualify for a “Lake Check” bracelet. **The Lake Check bracelet is required for those guests who wish to swim in our lake during official “Lake Swim” activity periods; children under the age of 13 require a life jacket, in addition to a “Lake Check” bracelet, to swim during “Lake Swim.”** **Please note that for the safety of our guests, swimming in the lake is only allowed when our Lifeguards are on duty, and life jackets are required for everyone at all times while using our boats (canoes, kayaks, paddleboards & paddleboats)!**
- **Trampoline:** One of our young campers' favorite things to do when they arrive at camp is to bounce on our trampoline! **For safety reasons, we ask that parents always chaperone their children on the trampoline when it is not a counselor-led activity.** Please be extra vigilant when older and younger children are sharing the trampoline at the same time. Thank you!

### **4:00 pm – 5:00 pm: Welcome Wine & Cheese Reception**

You are invited to our Welcome Reception. This is a great way to meet your fellow guests and some of our camp staff. Everyone in your family is invited to enjoy our selection of fruit & cheese platters! (NOTE: Complimentary Wine for guests aged 21+)

### **5:30 pm – 7:00 pm: Dinner**

Once you've settled into your room, our dinner will be served in the Main Lodge Dining Room. Guests can choose to eat indoors or outdoors, but we ask everyone to please bus your own tables and leave them clean for the next dining guests. Thank you! *If you will not arrive before dinner time, please call our front desk (559-565-3388) on your day of arrival and request that we prepare a dinner plate for each member of your party.*

### **7:15 pm: Welcome Meeting**

We ask all our guests to join us for our Welcome Meeting at 7:15 pm. Children will immediately be introduced to their camp counselors by age group, and head out to enjoy fun activities with our staff, ending with a sing-along campfire. Meanwhile, our adult guests will be introduced to our staff leaders and given an overview of the week ahead, including helpful tips and information on how to get the most out of your family's week of camp. Guests will also be provided with Monday's Activity Schedule and will receive each subsequent day's schedule at dinner each evening (you can pick up the next day's schedule at our front desk during dinner).

After the welcome meeting, the adults will meet with the leaders of the activity areas in the dining room to ask questions and/or to sign up for those activities that require it. **Please note that we try to keep additional charges to a minimum at Montecito, but participation in a few activities do come with a modest additional charge (e.g., Horseback-riding & Massages), due to the additional costs associated with offering these activities. Additionally, our “Artist” may charge guests for some of the fine art supplies that they offer for use in their classes.** Please feel free to ask our activity leaders about any extra charges associated with their activity areas. **Parents can pick up their children from the Campfire Logs area, just outside the Main Lodge, after they finish meeting with the activity leaders.**

## ***“Welcome to the Montecito Camp Family!”***

Each week our Family Camp strives to become a vibrant community, with each guest feeling connected to their family, our staff, and our other guests. Many of our guests return the same camp week, year after year, largely to maintain the relationships that they and their children have formed with our extended Montecito camp family.

Since we want to encourage our guests to enjoy and connect to our beautiful natural surroundings, learn and try new things, foster independence in a safe environment for our young campers, and to engage with each other as much as possible during camp, we choose not to provide the distractions of TVs or phones in our cabins or lodge rooms.

Due to our remote location, we do not have any cellular service. We feel this is a blessing in our mission to provide quality family time for our campers but realize that for many of our guests this will be an adjustment. Our campers do have access to our complimentary guest phone to make calls, when needed. We have also significantly upgraded our free Wi-Fi for our guests in recent years, but please keep in mind that we are dependent on Satellite Wi-Fi due to our remote wilderness location. Speeds should be better than in the past, but please be patient if there are issues at times, as a storm or other unforeseen issues can take out our Wi-Fi network temporarily. In those cases, we do have a remote technician on call. However, if you need access to the internet and are having difficulty connecting for whatever reason, please speak with our front desk staff for assistance. There is a Verizon tower in KCNP.

We hope you enjoy this opportunity to unplug, and at the same time, re-connect with yourself, your loved ones, and your new Montecito family!

### ***Accommodations & Amenities by Room/Cabin Type***

#### ***The Forest Cabins:***

Built in 2013 & 2017, our architects designed the Forest Cabins to let the outdoors in, while providing many of the comforts of home in a private and quiet forest setting. These cabins feature floor-to-ceiling windows and include a private deck with Adirondack chairs for your enjoyment. The open-concept main level features a King-sized bed, with a living room/kitchen bar area, and a beautiful Main Bath. The second floor has a small tree-house bunkroom for the children, featuring a twin bunk bed, and a half-bath. Please note that Cabins #401, #402 and #406 are all ADA-compliant, complete with a roll-in shower instead of a shower/bathtub combo.

**All bed linens, towels, eco-friendly toiletries (soap, shampoo/conditioner, moisturizer), and a blow-dryer are provided. Each of our forest cabins features a mini fridge & microwave for your convenience.** While in a very private location, please note that the cabins have floor-to-ceiling windows. **For guests who don't like to wake up with the sun streaming into their room, we recommend that you bring a sleep mask. Shy guests may desire to bring a robe to ensure privacy when the blinds are open.**

#### ***Vintage Lodge Rooms & Suites:***

Our traditional lodge rooms and vintage suites are in three separate lodge buildings: **The Main Lodge, Sugar Pine Lodge & Red Fir Lodge.** All of these lodges were built in the 70s, when Montecito Sequoia Camp was a prestigious girls' leadership camp under the direction of our founder, Dr. Virginia Barnes. **While they are older, these rooms have been remodeled and are designed to be practical and comfortable for our guests, while still maintaining a rustic “camp” feel.** They each have a private bath.

Our **Lakeview Suites**, located in **Lakeview Lodge**, have been completely remodeled with similar materials used in our Forest Cabins, and are designed for larger families who want more modern accommodations. Please note that LV Suite #125 is ADA-compliant.

**Our lodge rooms come in varying configurations to accommodate couples to large families, but each has a private bath. All bed linens, towels, eco-friendly toiletries (soap, shampoo/conditioner, moisturizer), and a blow-dryer are provided in each lodge room.**

#### ***Mountain View Cabins with Shared Bathhouse:***

Our rustic **Mountain View Cabins** offer a more authentic camp experience for our guests who love their simplicity and vintage feel. Each cabin features a King bed (up to 2 adults) and two sets of twin bunks (can sleep up to 4 children). **All bed linens, pillows, towels, and eco-friendly toiletries (soap, shampoo/conditioner, and moisturizer) are provided in each cabin.** Our Mountain View Cabin guests use one of our nearby shared bathhouses (Monty's or Lakeview bathhouse). Each bath house is a short walk from the Cabins, and is shared by MV Rustic Cabin guests, our staff, and our KILTs (Teen Counselors-in-Training). **As such, we recommend each MV Cabin guest bring a robe or sweats, flip flops, a flashlight, blow-dryer (if desired), and a carry-all for your toiletries.** Please notify our Front Desk if the bathhouse(s) needs the attention of our staff. Thank you!

## *Some Important Things to Know for New Family Camp Guests*

### **Altitude and Temperature:**

At 7400' elevation, we enjoy comfortable daytime summer temperatures during June, July, and August. Days are warm and sunny, between 70 – 85 degrees F, and our nights are cool and sometimes COLD, usually between 40 – 60 degrees F. As such, we do not have air conditioning as temperatures at camp are usually quite comfortable. That said, sometimes we will experience an unusually hot week or cold snap or thunderstorms during Family Camp, but these are usually rare. **Please note that it is also VERY important to keep hydrated and wear sunscreen at Montecito any time of the year due to the altitude. We recommend that you and your children drink lots of water and take it easy in the first 24-hours until your body adjusts to our altitude.** *We also recommend bringing Advil, Tylenol and/or Children's Tylenol, in case someone in your party needs it for dehydration/headache due to altitude.*

### **Casual Dress:**

Dress according to your own taste and preference, but remember this is camp, so casual clothing is best. Layering will help with the temperature differences between day and night. **We do request that campers please wear shoes at all times for safety, and to wear neat and clean clothes for dinner in the dining room.** *Please see our recommended packing list for more specific information regarding clothing and equipment.*

### **Housekeeping/Towel Exchange:**

**In order to save water and keep our camp price as low as possible, we do not offer daily housekeeping service.** When you arrive, your room will have been thoroughly cleaned and prepared for you: fresh linens & towels, beds made, toiletries provided, etc. Please let us know if something needs attending to in your room upon arrival, so that we can make your room as comfortable as possible. Please note that we do offer a **Towel Exchange** to guests on **Tuesdays** and **Thursdays**, each week of camp. **We ask that you please leave your dirty towels in the tub or on the floor of your room/cabin, and our staff will take your dirty towels and provide you with clean ones. Our staff will also empty your trash on these days.** *If you need clean sheets, more clean towels, or your room or bathroom cleaned during your stay, please go to the front desk to make arrangements.*

### **Mealtimes & Self-Bussing Policy:**

**Breakfast: 7:30 am – 9:00 am**

**Lunch: 12:00 pm – 1:30 pm**

**Dinner: 5:30 pm – 7:00 pm**

At Montecito, we prefer that families eat together. We have three hot meals a day, when parents are responsible for their children, unless they have another adult or babysitter caring for them. *Additionally, all our guests are welcome to help themselves to our 24/7 snacks & drinks in our breakfast kitchen and dining area anytime, day or night.*

**Self-bussing Policy:** **In an effort to keep camp as clean as possible, we ask our campers to do their part by self-bussing their family's dining tables after they complete their meal.** We have bear-proof garbage & recycle bins outdoors and regular trash/recycle bins indoors. We ask that all guests return their dishware/glassware/cutlery to the bussing bins located in our main dining room after meals. Wine, beer, or cocktail glasses should be returned to our Pine Box Bar for cleaning. Please teach your independent children to also use the bins during their stay, as older children will become used to “helping themselves” to snacks and drinks during their stay, and often forget to dispose of items properly. Thank you in advance for your assistance in helping to keep camp clean and welcoming to all!

### **Alcohol:**

Wine, beer, mixed drinks, and non-alcoholic beverages may be purchased/charged to your room from our Pine Box Bar in the Main Lodge, or our mobile Outdoor Bar when set up at special events (such as the Family Dance or Beach Party). **Please make sure to recycle any of your used glass bottles, plastic bottles, or cans, by placing them in the recycle bins on-site and return any Montecito glass/barware to the Pine Box Bar (or our Outdoor Bar when staff is present).** **A charity collects our recyclables regularly, so you will be helping a good cause if you use the recycling bins properly.** *Thank you!* **Also, any beverages brought in by our guests are subject to a corkage fee for our staff to open your bottles and/or provide you/your party with Montecito's glass/barware.**

### **Mountain Top Shop:**

Located near the Front Desk, our Mountain Top Gift Shop has Montecito T-shirts, sweatshirts, gifts, and sundries (like toothpaste, bug spray, soda, postcards, etc.) that you can charge to your room. If you forget something, see if we carry it here, or you can also check the **Stony Creek Lodge Market & Gas Station** (located 4 miles south of Montecito on the Generals Highway).

### Special Evening Events:

*Each Family Camp Week we host special evening events that the whole family can join in on the fun and get creative!*

#### **Bring Costumes, Musical Instruments and/or Props to make the most of our Special Evening Events:**

- **Theme Night** – Each week, we feature a special festive **Theme Night Family Dance**. To get the most enjoyment out of this event for your family, we ask that you bring a simple **COSTUME** related to the theme of your week. The more costumes we have, the more **FUN** the evening will be for all!
- **Coffee House** – Also during your camp week, we will host a **Coffee House** evening performance. Our guests and our staff are invited to perform a favorite song, play a musical instrument, tell a joke, or share a short story or poem, in an informal and supportive setting. A great opportunity for both first-time and seasoned performers!
- **Variety Show** – The highlight of your last evening of camp will be an **ALL-CAMP Variety Show!** We hope you take time before camp to “brush up your act” to **share singing, dancing, musical instruments, magic, or corny skits**. Children will also be invited to perform a skit with their kids’ group. Acts are limited to 2-3 minutes on stage to provide time for everyone to share their talents.

### Parents with Infants and Small Children (aged 6 to 23 months):

- Parents with children aged 6 to 23 months have a play yard with toys and playthings available and are invited to participate with the Minnows & Tadpoles group activities anytime, if a parent or babysitter stays with the under-2-year-old child to provide the one-on-one attention that infants/toddlers need.
- We recommend that you bring everything necessary for traveling with small children. We are in a secluded location, so you may not be able to purchase some baby items close by. We also recommend bringing any medicines that your child might need. Our kitchen offers central refrigeration where you may keep special formulas for foods for your little one(s).
- We do have a limited number of play-cribs available for our guests but find that many parents prefer to bring their own. Please let our reservations office know if you would like us to provide you with a port-a-crib.

### Babysitting:

Many of our staff and KILTs would love to babysit your child(ren) during their time off! If you would like to go on a long hike, or mountain-bike ride, or simply want to take a nap, get a massage, or read a book while someone cares for your child, you can hire one of our staff. Feel free to ask a staff member directly if they would like to babysit for you or check the list of sitters at our Front Desk or ask our primary leader to help find you a sitter. **The babysitting rate will be announced at the Welcome Meeting on Sunday.**

### Wi-Fi, Telephone, TV:

While we hope that you can “unplug” during your vacation with us, we understand that some of our guests will need to stay in touch. Please note that there is no cell service in our remote mountain location, but we do offer the following ways to communicate with the outside world:

- **Wi-Fi:** We offer free Wi-Fi to our guests via satellite. We have significantly upgraded our Wi-Fi as access improves in our remote wilderness location, but it still will be slower and/or not as reliable as your home connection. We appreciate your patience. Please see our Front Desk staff for help if you need access urgently, or if you are having difficulty accessing Wi-Fi.
- **Telephone:** If you need to use a telephone during your stay, we have a free public phone for guest use. It is in the stairwell behind the front desk. If you need to have someone reach you while staying at the lodge, have them call the Front Desk @ 559-565-3388. We can take a message for you, and you can call them back. We will post messages on the phone message board next to the Front Desk. Some guests have had success making calls over our Wi-Fi network.
- **TV:** Most of our guests prefer that there be no TV viewing while at camp, but we do have a flat-screen TV in the Ponderosa Room for special events (i.e., Sports Championships, Olympics, etc.). Please respect other guests, or our staff, if they request to turn off the TV, especially during mealtimes.

### Staff Gratuities:

We are very proud of our staff at Montecito and believe that the quality of our staff directly correlates to the quality of your family camp experience. **Your generosity at the end of your camp week, in the form of a staff gratuity, will help show your appreciation to our staff and help them pay directly for things such as their continuing education, end-of-summer travel, living expenses, and/or savings.** We pool all the gratuities at the end of each week to be shared equally by our staff. We believe that when the gratuities are equally shared, it provides a greater incentive for better teamwork and better service from everyone. We couldn’t do what we do without having a great team! We thank you for your generosity towards our staff and hope that their service exceeds your expectations.

**(Recommended but optional guideline: 10% of your Family Camp rate. Gratuities are very much appreciated – Thank you)!**

- Flip Flops, Sandals, or Beach Shoes (for beach, pool & bathhouses)
- Hats or Visors for sun protection
- Sunglasses
- Rain Poncho or Windbreaker with hood (in case of rain)
- Personal & Toiletry items (toothbrush, toothpaste, floss, razor, favorite shampoo/conditioner, makeup, feminine hygiene products, hairbrush, comb, diapers & swim diapers for little ones, etc.)
- Medications (OTC and/or Prescription)
- Bathrobe, Toiletry Bag or Carry-all (optional, but recommended for Mountain View Cabin guests for shared bathhouse)
- Slippers/Sleep Mask (optional, but recommended for Forest Cabin guests)
- **Reusable Water Bottles for your family!**
- Flashlight
- Inexpensive Watch (preferably waterproof)
- **NOTE: Please bring a sleeping bag for each of your children, Ages 7-18, who want to participate in our Kids' Groups' Overnight Campouts (broken out by age group).**

### Recommended For Each Family:

- **BRING YOUR COMPLETED FAMILY HEALTH FORM & ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK FORM with you!**
- BRING Theatrical Costumes, Musical Instruments or Props for Evening Events such as our Theme Party, Coffee House & Variety Show Nights (optional, but recommended)
- Camera, Smartphone, or GoPro to take pictures/videos (remember Film, Camera Card, batteries, chargers)
- Any medications (prescription and over-the-counter; we recommend bringing Advil/Children's Advil for headaches due to dehydration/altitude)
- Sunscreen (LOTS!)
- Bug Spray
- Shoe box or bag to bring home craft projects

### Additional Items Recommended for Families traveling with infants and toddlers:

- Port-a-crib; please contact our reservations office before you arrive if you would like us to provide you with one.
- Baby Formula/Bottles/Pacifiers/favorite snacks (We can refrigerate your formula/snacks in our kitchen)
- Disposable Diapers/Wipes/Baby Lotion/Baby Shampoo/Swim Diapers/Floaties or Swim Vest, etc.
- Stroller, harness, or baby carrier

### Optional Items:

- Hair Dryer (optional; some provided in rooms or available at Front Desk)
- **Your Personal Mountain Bike (We do have bikes available for rent, HOWEVER - There is no added charge for guided Mountain Bike rides if you use your own bike!)**
- Your Personal Tennis/Pickleball Racquet & Balls (for enthusiasts; we supply racquets & balls for novice players)
- Your Favorite Board Games & Cards (some board games are available to use at the Lodge)
- Books for pleasure reading (we have some books for children and adults to borrow at the Lodge)
